B&O BICYCLE TOUR AT LUCAS OIL RACEWAY

The 28th annual B&O Bicycle Tour showcases five miles of the B&O Trail as well as scenic countryside. You can choose from 12-, 25-, 45-, or 67-mile loops. After the ride, stick around for lunch and live music. The longest route (67 miles) will go to Roachdale, which is significant because it is the next town on the B&O Railroad after North Salem. There will be a SAG stop at the town park.

WHERE

After great comments about last year's ride location, the ride will once again begin and end at Lucas Oil Raceway, 10267 E US-136, Indianapolis, Indiana. DO NOT ENTER THE MAIN ENTRANCE ON US-136. ENTER GATE 6 FROM CR1000E (see map).

From I-465, take US-136 (Crawfordsville Road) 4.0 miles west through Clermont to 1000E and turn left. Go 0.6 miles on 1000E and enter Lucas Oil Raceway through Gate 6 on your left.

From I-74, take Ronald Reagan Parkway south 0.6 mile to Connector Road and turn right. From Connector Road, turn left onto US-136 and go 0.5 miles to 1000E and turn right. Go 0.6 mile on 1000E and enter Lucas Oil Raceway through Gate 6 on your left.

From the south, take Ronald Reagan Parkway to 300N. Turn right on 300N and go 0.2 miles to 1000E and turn left. Go 0.5 mile and enter Lucas Oil Raceway through Gate 6 on your right.

START TIME

Sign-in begins at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 6, 2020. The 45- and 67-mile riders will depart at 8:30; the 25-mile riders at 8:45; the 12-mile riders at 9:00.

WHO

Whether you're a family of beginners, an experienced touring cyclist, or a club rider, the B&O Bicycle Tour is for you. It's not a race.

WHAT'S FOR LUNCH

Listen to live music as you enjoy a fantastic BBQ lunch catered by Pit Stop Barbecue and Grill restaurant immediately after the ride. Finish off your lunch with a frozen treat from Schwan's Frozen Foods, free to all participants. Thank you to Aqua Systems for donating water and Piazza Produce for the fruit.

SEE YOURSELF ON INSTAGRAM

During the ride, take pictures and post them on Instagram, #bobikeride. We will show the pictures on a continuous loop throughout the day back at the Lucas Oil Pavilion. You can enjoy them as you eat lunch and listen to music.

SAFETY

HCTDA's primary concern is the safety of participants. Therefore, bicycle helmets are required, and riders are expected to obey all traffic regulations. Thanks to the Brownsburg Police Department, Roachdale Town Marshal, and Hendricks County Sheriff Department for traffic control.

DONATIONS

Consider giving a donation to the B&O Trail in addition to your ride entry fee. We are diligently working to extend the trail to both the east and west and just submitted an application to Indiana's NextLevel Trails Grant program. If



we receive a grant, we will need local funds to provide a match. HCTDA is an IRS 501(c)(3) nonprofit, so your donation is tax deductible.

REGISTER ONLINE AND SAVE MONEY

You can register online at www.BOtrail.org. You can save money on the Old Fashion Days Bike Tour (Labor Day in North Salem) if you register for it online while you are registering for the B&O Bicycle Tour. Just look for the Old Fashion Days registration category. It will be \$20 compared to the regular price of \$30.

LATE REGISTRATION

You may register the day of the ride, but the fee increases (see registration form).

T-SHIRTS

Souvenir T-shirts are available to pre-registered riders for an extra cost. A limited number of shirts will be available for purchase the day of the ride.

SPECIAL FEATURES **OF RIDE**

Riders will start out "sprinting" down the world famous quarter mile drag strip at Lucas Oil Raceway. This is the home of the National Drags. After exiting the raceway, all riders will ride on the B&O Trail. The 12-mile route will turn around in the trailhead at the end of the paved trail. Other distances will ride to the end of the trail, exit the trail, and continue through the scenic farmlands of Hendricks County. As always, the B&O Bicycle Tour encourages families and novice riders, as well as experienced bicyclists, to enjoy the sport of bicycling. To make the ride family-friendly, there will be SAG stops on all routes, even the 12-miler, and kids 12 and under are free! Each stop will feature homemade cookies, treats, and fruit, as well as plenty of water and port-o-lets. On the longer routes, there will be a SAG stop featuring free pizza at Perillo's Pizzeria in North Salem. SAG vehicles will be roving the routes to assist with minor mechanical problems or fatigue. Routes are marked on the roads, but route maps are provided as a backup.

Mechanics from Bicycle Outfitters Indy will be on hand to answer mechanical questions and assist riders with pre-ride inspections. The first 300 riders will receive a souvenir water bottle sponsored by Wellness Events, LLC. Riders will enjoy live music as they eat a BBQ lunch from Pit Stop Barbecue and Grill (10:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) including a frozen treat from Schwan's Foods. Lunch is included with registration. The Maplewood SAG stop will feature live music by the Avon High School Jazz Band.

TOUR DESCRIPTIONS

12 miles — Ideal for beginning cyclists and families: an easy-going, flat ride; you will "sprint" down the world famous drag strip. After exiting Lucas Oil Raceway, you will travel over five miles on the B&O Trail, taking in the murals in the Ronald Reagan Parkway tunnel and the bridge over White Lick Creek. It returns the same route. There is a SAG stop about halfway through the ride near the Green Street crossing.

25 miles — After sprinting down the dragstrip and exiting Lucas Oil Raceway, you will ride over five miles on the B&O Trail, viewing the murals in the Ronal Reagan Parkway tunnel and the beautiful White Lick Creek bridge. You will then ride on county roads to the SAG stop at Maplewood. Enjoy refreshments and music before your return trip through the picturesque Hendricks County countryside. You re-enter the trail at the same spot you exited and return to Lucas Oil Raceway for lunch.

45 miles — This route starts out the same as the 25-miler. After leaving the Maplewood SAG stop, continue west through scenic farmland to the SAG stop at Perillo's Pizzeria in North Salem. Your loop takes you back to the Maplewood SAG for a second visit, then returns you to Lucas Oil Raceway for lunch via the B&O Trail.

67 miles — This route start out the same as the 25- and 45-milers. After the Maplewood SAG stop, continue west to the SAG stop at beautiful McCloud Park, provided by the Hendricks County Parks and Rec. You will encounter a few moderate hills near McCloud. Continue through rolling Putnam County countryside to Roachdale and an additional SAG stop at the Roachdale Town Park. On the return trip, there will be a SAG stop in North Salem at Perillo's Pizzeria.

Check-in begins at 7:00 a.m. in the pavilion at Lucas Oil Raceway, 10267 US-136, Indianapolis, IN. DO NOT ENTER THE MAIN ENTRANCE ON US-136. ENTER GATE 6 FROM CR 1000E (see map). Registration fees support Hendricks County Trail Development Association, a non-profit group promoting the development of recreational trails in Hendricks County, specifically on the former B&O Railroad corridor. 
